



Introduction

Uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the unique ethos of King Edward VI School. We believe our uniform:

- instils pride;
- supports positive behaviour and discipline;
- encourages identity with, and support for, the School ethos;
- ensures that students of all races and backgrounds feel welcome;
- protects students from social pressures to dress in a particular way;
- nurtures cohesion and promotes good relations between different groups of students;
- enhances participation and enjoyment of sport when students feel comfortable in their PE clothing; and
- supports effective teaching and learning.

Establishing the Policy

The Uniform Policy aims to be fair, reasonable and affordable. The School has consulted widely in formulating the uniform requirements (including with students and parents).

High priority is given to cost considerations. Wherever possible the School has ensured that the uniform can be purchased from high street shops, other retail outlets and internet suppliers. However, where it has been determined that branded or unique items are required from the School outfitters (Number 57 Schoolwear), the School makes regular price, quality, durability and service comparisons with different stockists and considers important issues such as cost and availability of non-standard sizes.

This is in line with the School's best value statement. Support is provided to parents via:

- a widely publicised and clearly explained scheme for the remission of cost operated by the School.
- financial support offered by the School for those who have difficulties in affording the uniform.
- a successful low cost second-hand uniform scheme run by the FoKES.
- an effective system to re-unite named lost property with its owner.

The School does not operate as a uniform supplier and gains no financial benefit through the relationship with Number 57 Schoolwear. The uniform requirements and cost of supplying the uniform are reviewed regularly by the Governors Leadership and Management Group. Any future changes to the uniform requirements would include a transitional period for phasing out the old and introducing the new.

Applying the Policy

The School ensures that the policy is clear and well publicised via the School website, the School Rules, admissions information and in the Home-School Agreement. The School will carefully consider any request that is made from the parents of Year 7-11 or from Sixth Form students to vary the policy to meet the needs of any individual student (e.g. to accommodate their religion or beliefs or medical conditions). Requests should be made in writing to the Headmaster in advance of any proposed variation being implemented. Where a student is not adhering to the uniform requirements, the School will discretely try to establish why not. The Headmaster, or a person authorised by the Headmaster, may ask a student with no good reason to go home to remedy the breach. In all such cases parents will be notified and the absence will be recorded. If a student repeatedly infringes the School's rules on uniform, this will constitute a disciplinary offence and may be grounds for suspension.

School Uniform (Years 7-11)

Students must wear full School uniform at all times except where otherwise directed by a member of staff. This includes lunch queue, dining hall, clubs and societies. The exception is during break times when students are playing on the Quad.

The School will carefully consider any request that is made from the parents of Year 7-11 or from Sixth Form students to vary the policy to meet the needs of any individual student (e.g. to accommodate their religion or beliefs or medical conditions). Requests should be made in writing to the Headmaster in advance of any proposed variation being implemented.

Hair

Hairstyle should conform to a reasonable norm which will be determined by the Headmaster. The following, for example, are not allowed: close shaved cuts such as skinheads and skinfades (less than clippers setting No.4), sculpted styles such as mullets and mohawks, unnaturally coloured dyed hair, pony tails, hair in excess of collar length or over the eyes. We acknowledge that Afro-textured hair is an important part of our Black students' racial, ethnic, cultural, and religious identities, and may require specific styling such as afros, braids and cornrows for hair health and maintenance. Headwear, such as turbans, may be worn for religious or cultural reasons. Students should be clean-shaven. Beards and/or moustaches are not permitted except for religious or cultural reasons. Side burns must not be lower than the bottom of the ear.

Jewellery

No jewellery should be worn in School, including bangles and wristbands, except where such items are worn for religious or cultural reasons. No ear, body or face piercing is allowed. Any jewellery worn when participating in contact sports represents a risk of injury to the wearer and other players. For this reason, such items are expected to be removed. If the wearer does not wish to take off any items for religious or cultural reasons then they will be required to cover the item securely with a sweatband or tape for the duration of the activity to minimise the risk of injury to themselves and others.

Sportswear

It is our hope that all students will represent the School in at least one sport during their time at K.E.S. We believe that the School crest on the playing kit contributes to the students' sense of pride in doing so. It also facilitates the returning of property lost on away fixtures. Parents are requested to clearly name all items of uniform to assist in this process.

The sports clothing contained in the uniform requirements have been carefully selected to:

- ensure safety (e.g. safety studs, gum shields)
- maximise flexibility of use across different sports (e.g. shorts that can be worn for PE and Games)
- ensure durability
- take account of different climatic conditions.

Senior Squad members are often given the option to purchase their own kit. Most retain them after leaving K.E.S as a reminder of their time at the School.

Appearance

The general appearance of students should conform to a reasonable norm, (including shirts neatly tucked in and ties done-up with top buttons fastened) which, if necessary, shall be determined by the Headmaster. School scarves, beanies and training rain jackets may be worn to and from School as can plain black/navy woollen scarves, plain black/navy woollen hats and plain black/navy coats. Students are welcome to add fluorescent strips to bags or coats in order to make them visible in the dark. Baseball caps and other hats are not permitted at any time except on field trips as specified by the teacher in charge. Students are asked not to engage in public displays of affection. It is important that each student should project an image that would bring credit to himself and the School.

Shirt Sleeve Order

Shirt Sleeve Order is declared by the Headmaster for a week at a time in periods of hot weather (as a rule of thumb, shirt sleeve order will be declared when daytime temperatures are forecast to be consistently above 25 degrees Celsius). During this period the following regulations apply, including when travelling to and from School:

- Ties may be removed and top buttons undone.
- Blazers/jackets are not required (If boys choose to wear their blazer/jacket during Shirt Sleeve Order they must also wear their tie).
- Shirts must remain tucked in.
- Blazers/jackets and ties should be placed in lockers or left at home.

Coats

Coats must be stored in lockers. Given our small site, there is no need for coats to be worn for the short time and distance taken to move between lessons. However, as with Shirt Sleeve Order, a variation is made to uniform rules to cope with extreme weather (as a rule of thumb, coats are allowed for a week when daytime temperatures are forecast to be consistently below freezing). During this time students are asked to take extra care as coats stored on the back of chairs represent a trip-hazard in our small classrooms.

Sixth Form Dress Code

Sixth Form Dress Code – Female Students

Students must adhere to the Sixth Form Dress Code at all times except where otherwise directed by a member of staff. The School will carefully consider any request that is made from the parents of Year 7-11 or from Sixth Form students to vary the policy to meet the needs of any individual student (e.g. to accommodate their religion or beliefs or medical conditions). Requests should be made in writing to the Headmaster in advance of any proposed variation being implemented.

Hair

Hairstyle should conform to a reasonable norm which will be determined by the Headmaster. The following, for example, are not allowed: skinheads and skinfades (less than clippers setting No.4), sculpted styles such as mullets and mohawks and unnaturally coloured dyed hair. We acknowledge that Afro-textured hair is an important part of our Black students' racial, ethnic, cultural, and religious identities, and may require specific styling such as afros, braids and cornrows for hair health and maintenance. Headwear, such as headscarfs, may be worn for religious or cultural reasons.

Jewellery

Jewellery should be discreet and unobtrusive. No body or facial piercing is allowed. Any jewellery worn when participating in contact sports represents a risk of injury to the wearer and other players. For this reason, such items are expected to be removed. If the wearer does not wish to take off any items for religious or cultural reasons then they will be required to cover the item securely with a sweatband or tape for the duration of the activity to minimise the risk of injury to themselves and others.

Appearance

The general appearance of students should conform to a reasonable norm, (which includes blouses neatly tucked in) which, if necessary, shall be determined by the Headmaster. Make-up and nail varnish, if used at all, should be subtle. For safeguarding reasons it is important for female students to wear the Guild Cross pin badge at all times to identify themselves to other students and staff as members of the School. Baseball caps and other hats are not permitted at any time except on field trips as specified by the teacher in charge.

Shirt Sleeve Order

Shirt Sleeve Order is declared by the Headmaster for a week at a time in periods of hot weather (as a rule of thumb, shirt sleeve order will be declared when daytime temperatures are forecast to be consistently above 25 degrees Celsius). During this period the following regulations apply, including when travelling to and from School:

- Ties may be removed and top buttons undone.
- Blazers/jackets are not required.
- Blazers/jackets should be placed in lockers or left at home.

Coats

Checklist

All the following items are compulsory and can be purchased from any retailer (unless stated).

Item	Notes
Tailored Suit Plain dark grey, black or navy.	Single or double breasted <u>tailored</u> formal business style suit. This should be a matching jacket and trousers/skirt, with conventional collar & lapels and buttons. <u>Though skirt length is not defined, skirts must be part of the suit and not be made of jersey fabric. Trousers must be part of the suit, and may be of a tapered style but not skin-tight.</u> No pinstripes, checks or exaggerated styles of jacket, trousers or skirts are allowed. If there are any doubts, students are encouraged to discuss the matter first with the Head of Sixth Form before purchasing.
Formal Business Blouse Plain single coloured	No checks, stripes or patterns. Blouses must have a collar, buttons and not be of a see-through material or have bare shoulders.
Guild Cross Pin Badge Silver	Students are provided with a pin badge as part of the Enrolment process. For safeguarding reasons, these must be

	worn at all times to identify the wearer as a member of the School. Additional badges may be purchased from the Sixth Form Office. Prefect and Colours badges are awarded to individual Sixth Form students.
V-neck Pullovers / Cardigans (Optional) Plain single coloured	No round necks, logos, stripes, patterns, hoods, collars or zips. If worn, pullovers or cardigans must be longer than blouses. Jackets must be able to be worn over the top.
Plain Tights, Stockings or Socks	Natural or black tights. Socks any colour but white.
Shoes Black	Not brown, must be polishable with sensible heels. Boots are not permitted.
Bag or Case	Must be of a design that will enable books to be carried without being damaged.
Sports Clothing	Any colour. Must be genuine sports clothing. Members of the performance sports teams will be informed of the kit requirements by the member of staff in charge.

Sixth Form Dress Code – Male Students
